

ORDINANCE NO. 2710

An ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell, Chapter 9 Criminal Code, to prohibit the removal of alcoholic beverages from premises licensed to dispense alcoholic beverages for consumption by-the-drink.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that Chapter 9 Criminal Code of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell, Section 9-39.1 Restriction on sale and possession of opened metal or glass containers and consumption of beverages therefrom is hereby amended as follows:

Chapter 9 - Criminal Code, Section 9-39.1 in the title thereto delete "metal or glass."

Chapter 9 - Criminal Code, Section 9-39.1 Restriction on sale and possession of opened metal or glass containers and consumption of beverages therefrom delete all language and replace with the following:

"(A) No holder of a permit for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages intended for consumption on the premises shall knowingly permit any individual, whether patron, customer, employee or otherwise, to remove any alcoholic beverage from the premises whether in a container made of glass, bottle, can, paper or plastic cup, go-cup, or otherwise unless said container is unopened and sealed.

(B) No person, whether patron, employee, customer, or otherwise, shall remove any alcoholic beverage from the premises of the holder of a permit for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises in a container of any type, whether glass, bottle, can, paper or plastic cup, go-cup, or otherwise unless said container is unopened and sealed.

(C) All holders of permits for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises shall post a conspicuous notice inside their premises as well as by each exit stating that it is illegal to remove


6 any alcoholic beverages intended for consumption on the premises
7 from the premises in any type of unsealed or open container of any
8 kind and that said violators shall be subject to fine and/or
9 imprisonment under city ordinance.

10 (D) Containers such as glass, plastic, and go-cups which are not sealed
11 by the manufacturer shall have a minimum seal consisting of tape
12 attaching the lid to the cup. Lids shall either contain no perforation for
13 the insertion of a straw or any such perforation shall be sealed with
14 tape.


15 (E) Whoever violates any provisions of this subsection shall be fined on
16 the first offense two hundred dollars (\$200.00), on the second offense
17 five hundred dollars (\$500.00), and on the third or subsequent offense
18 shall be fined five hundred dollars (\$500.00) plus suffer the revocation
19 of its permit to sell alcoholic beverages of any type.
