ORDINANCE NO. 1250

SOLID WASTE ORDINANCES UPDATED

An Ordinance updating the Slidell Code of Ordinances on
solid waste collections and making it unlawful to abandon
refrigerators.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council, in legal
session convened, that Section 11-14, 11-15, 11-16, 11-18, 11-19, 11-23, 11-24,
11-25, 11-26, 11-27, 11-33, 11-35, 11-36, 11-36.1, 11-37, 11-38, and 11-39 of
the Slidell Code of Ordinances, adopted by Ordinance Number 613, March 3rd, 1959,
be amended as follows:

SECTION 11-14. Delete the paragraph beginning "Business house" and
replace it with the following: Commercial Unit is defined as a store, shop or
office where business is conducted. A shopping center would contain several
commercial units.

After the paragraph beginning "Householder", add two (2) paragraphs to
read:

"Industrial Unit is defined as a place of business where manufacturing,
canning, assembling, processing and the like are conducted. More specifically,
manufacturing uses are those types delineated in the Slidell Zoning Ordinance
under Industrial Districts."

"Solid Waste is defined as garbage and trash and discarded household
goods. It shall not include hazardous wastes, e.i., any chemical, compound, mix-
ture, substance or article which is designated by the United States Environmental
Protection Agency or appropriate agency of the State to be "hazardous". It shall
also not include large automobile or other vehicle parts."

SECTION 11-15. Delete and replace with: Minimum service level
commercial collection: The City or its private contractor shall collect solid
waste twice each week not to exceed two (2) thirty-two (32) gallon containers
each day from each commercial unit in the city limits. The charge shall be the
same as for residential customers and the commercial customer has the option of
accepting or rejecting this service.

SECTION 11-16. Delete and replace with: The City of Slidell or its
private contractor will collect solid waste twice each week from all households

1 in the city limits except households in buildings containing five (5) or more
2 families. Those multi-family buildings (five or more) and commercial customers
3 not using minimum level service must contract with a private collector to pro-
4 vide solid waste collection at least once a week.
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9 There shall be no limit to the number of containers that each single
10 family unit shall put out for collection provided that they are generated by that
11 unit.
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15 SECTION 11-18. Delete and replace with: Every household and every
16 commercial and industrial unit in the city limits shall provide a container or
17 containers capable of handling a week's accumulation of trash in a sanitary manner
18 with a tight fitting cover capable of preventing the entrance of vectors. If a
19 household or business is serviced by the city or its private contractor (minimum
20 level service), its solid waste shall be placed in containers of more than twenty
21 (20) gallons and not more than thirty-two (32) gallons, constructed of plastic,
22 metal or fiberglass, having handles of adequate strength of lifting, or plastic,
23 paper, cardboard or other containers with sufficient wall strength to maintain
24 physical integrity when lifted by the top. The mouth of the container shall
25 have a diameter greater than or equal to that of the base, the weight of the
26 container and its contents shall not exceed seventy-five (75) pounds.

40 SECTION 11-23. Delete.

41 SECTION 11-24. Paragraph (b): Change 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

42 SECTION 11-25. Delete and replace with: "Large accumulations of
43 trees, branches, stumps, etc. of over one (1) cubic yard or unbundled trash at
44 any residential unit shall be collected by a special pick-up. The customer shall
45 call the City of Slidell or its private contractor to arrange the pick-up. The
46 customer shall be charged per cubic yard or a minimum of \$5.00 for each collection
47 for such items picked up. If the bill is not paid within thirty (30) days, the
48 City shall send notice by registered mail to the owner as listed on the City's
49 tax rolls. If the bill is still unpaid within thirty (30) days, the City shall
50 have, when duly recorded in the records of St. Tammany Parish, a lien and privilege
51 upon the real property of the said owner or owners for such expenses and said
52 amount shall be carried as an assessment against said property upon the tax rolls
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1 of the City and may be collected in the same manner as are all taxes of the City.

2 SECTION 11-26. Delete Paragraph (c).

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4 SECTION 11-27. Paragraph (b): Change five dollars (\$5.00) to

7 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

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9 SECTION 11-33. After the words "sanitation department", add: or
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11 employees of a private contractor under contract with the City.

12 SECTION 11-35. Delete.

13 SECTION 11-36. Delete.

14 SECTION 11-36.1. Delete.

15 SECTION 11-37. Change to SECTION 11-35.


16 SECTION 11-39. Change to SECTION 11-36.


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18 After SECTION 11-36, add: "SECTION 11-37. It shall be unlawful for
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20 any person, organization, firm or corporation to abandon or place out of doors
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22 on any lot, tract, parcel of ground, right-of-way, or area where children may
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24 be playing or have access in the city limits, refrigerators, deep freezers, or
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26 other similar containers that, upon closing, air is prevented from reaching the
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28 interior of said refrigerators, provided, however, that such appliances may be
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30 disposed of in any solid waste disposal site meeting all City, Parish and State
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32 regulations. They may be placed out for special pick-up only if sealed to prevent
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34 entry.
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
