ORDINANCE NUMBER 1315

An Ordinance limiting the erection of off-premises billboard advertising signs within the Slidell city limits.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, that the erection of new off-premises billboard advertising signs is hereby limited to single level billboard structures not less than five-hundred (500) feet from an existing billboard on the same side of the street. The maxium area of the face of any off-premises billboard sign, with the exception of any billboard erected upon limited access interstate highway, shall be three-hundred (300) square feet inclusive of any border and trim but excluding the base or supports. Said limitation shall be in effect for a period of twelve (12) months from the adoption of this ordinance or until a new sign ordinance is adopted by the Slidell City Council, whichever occurs first.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the following definitions are made a part of and shall apply to this ordinance only:

Billborad - A structure 72 sq. ft. or greater utilized for advertising and establishment, an activity, a product, service or entertainment, which is sold, produced, manufactured, available or furnished at a place other than on the property on which said sign is located.

Single Level Billboard - A Billboard which is limited to one panel facing any particular direction.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any Billboard structure presently existing which is destroyed through an act of God, vandalism, or other forces beyond the control of the owner of said structure may be rebuilt.
