ORDINANCE NO. 1353

An ordinance declaring the "Eddins House" surplus and for
sale by sealed bids to the highest bidder.

WHEREAS, as the City of Slidell has been donated the "Eddins House"
through the graciousness of Mr. Bill Eddins, and

WHEREAS, the building is located on the land to be used for a post
office and must therefore be moved, and

WHEREAS, the city has investigated the possibility of moving the
house and found it too expensive, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Slidell City Council, in legal
session convened, that the Eddins' House is hereby declared surplus and no
longer needed for public purposes.

The Mayor of the City of Slidell is hereby authorized to sell the
Eddins' House to the highest sealed bid.

The time and place of such bids as well as other particulars relating
to the sale may be fixed by the Mayor, providing however, that the City of
Slidell shall accept no bid in a lesser amount than \$1,000.00.
