ORDINANCE NO. 1359

An ordinance calling for an election on April 4th, 1981, to undedicate fifty percent (50%) of the sales tax.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, that an election shall be held on April 4th, 1981, in the City of Slidell, at which election there shall be submitted to all registered voters qualified and entitled to vote at said election under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to wit:

PROPOSITION

Proposition to undedicate fifty percent (50%) of the sales tax collected by the City of Slidell for the purpose of making said fifty percent (50%) of said tax available for use by the City as may be deemed necessary by the Mayor and the governing authority.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval by the Mayor.
