ORDINANCE NO. 3267

An ordinance imposing a moratorium on the issuance of permits or licenses relative to pain management clinics.

WHEREAS, in the past the City of Slidell has experienced the adverse effects of clinics which prescribe pain medications without valid medical reasons therefor; and

WHEREAS, such prescriptions cause or continue drug addictions by citizens of Slidell and others who are present within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to study the issue of pain management clinics with regard to possible regulation thereof.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that:

- 1. A moratorium is hereby imposed prohibiting the issuance of any permits or licenses or any other action by the City which would allow the location or conducting of any business such as pain management clinics, pain clinics, pain centers, pain rehabilitation centers and other such healthcare facilities within the City of Slidell; and
- 2. This moratorium hereby imposed shall be effective for 180 days but may be extended by the Slidell City Council as it deems necessary; and
- 3. Businesses in the nature of pain management clinics which are currently and validly operating within the City are not subject to this moratorium except that transfer of

ownership of such businesses shall be prohibited during the existence of this moratorium or any extension thereof; and

This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption. 4.
