ORDINANCE NO. 3911

An ordinance declaring certain property of the City of Slidell surplus and setting the method of disposing same.

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2012, the City of Slidell purchased the following described property with funding from the FEMA flood mitigation program:

THAT CERTAIN LOT OR PORTION OF GROUND, together with all the buildings and improvements thereon, and all the rights, ways, privileges, servitudes, appurtenances and advantages thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, situated in Palm Lake Addition in Section 44, Township 9 South, Range 14 East, City of Slidell, 9th Ward, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana.

And in accordance with a plat of the rearrangement of Lot 64 in Square 3 of Said Palm Lake Addition by William Maier, C.E., Dated May 14, 1996 and approved by the authorized representatives for the city of Slidell on April 26, 1967 and shown by the signatures of Floyd Fogg, Chairman of the Zoning and Planning Commission, F.N. Cusimano, and John Swenson, City Clerk, said plat is on record in the office of the Clerk of Court, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana.

Lot 64, Square 3, Palm Lake Addition, City of Slidell, Louisiana.

WHEREAS, the property owner adjacent to Lot 64, Square 3, Palm Lake Addition, City of Slidell (223 West Camellia Drive, Slidell, Louisiana 70458) desires to lease the property for the express use as an extension of present lawn/yard space; and

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WHEREAS, the City has no present use for this property.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that Lot 64, Square 3, Palm Lake Addition, City of Slidell (223 West Camellia Drive, Slidell, Louisiana 70458) is not presently needed by the City of Slidell and is hereby declared surplus and shall be leased to the adjacent landowner for the sum of ONE AND NO/100 DOLLAR per year for ten (10) years for the express use as an extension of present lawn/yard space. The term of this lease is for ten (10) years with an option to renew for an additional ten (10) year period on the same terms and conditions.
