## **ORDINANCE NO. 4066**

An ordinance authorizing a salary adjustment for the City engineer.

WHEREAS, in the revised Revenue, Expense and Capital Budget for fiscal year 2021-2022 (first supplemental budget), the City made appropriations sufficient to support a salary adjustment of three percent (3%), on an annualized basis, for the City engineer (see p. 3 of first supplemental budget); and

WHEREAS, City administration has provided appropriate justification for granting a proposed salary adjustment to the City engineer in said amount, consistent with Section 21-1 of the City's Code of Ordinances.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that it approves the granting of a salary adjustment to the City engineer, in the amount of three percent (3%), on an annualized basis, setting his annual base salary at \$128,176.00, exclusive of any car allowance to be integrated.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance (including the salary adjustment authorized herein) shall take effect February 14, 2022.

Blaine was the responsible Engineer for the Hurricane Katrina City-wide Improved Infrastructure projects awarded by the FEMA totaling approximately \$75M (soft and hard cost) and the Hazard Mitigation projects totaling approximately \$22M. Blaine successfully contracted proposals for the significantly improved Team Slidell pre/post storm readiness initiative that enabled Team Slidell to successfully execute preparation, ride-out and recovery operations to minimize the impacts of Hurricane IDA.
