WHEREAS, Mr. George Dunbar was instrumental in establishing the Mayor's Slidell Commission on the Arts (which developed into the Department of Cultural & Public Affairs) as well as designing the original Slidell Cultural Center on Erlanger Street; and

WHEREAS, as part of the "Greatest Generation", Mr. Dunbar is a World War II Veteran, serving in the Navy; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dunbar has developed over 60 different unique, legacy living communities and neighborhoods from Mississippi to Louisiana, including River Oaks, Chamale, and Coin du Lestin subdivisions.; and
