ORDINANCE NO. 4074

An ordinance amending Chapter 2, Article I, Section 2-1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell, to clarify the requirements for the naming of part of a City building and certain other City property after a living person and to provide for custom signage cost responsibilities whenever a City building or other City property is named in honor of a person.

WHEREAS, Chapter 2, Article I, Section 2-1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell currently provides certain general requirements for the naming of part of a City building after a living person.

WHEREAS, the City desires to clarify the scope of the provisions of section 2-1 of said Article, consistent with La. R.S. 42:267, and to add a requirement related to the payment for custom signage, plaques, or other memorials required or desired in connection with City property naming designations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that Chapter 2 (Administration), Article I (In General), Section 2-1 (General Rules) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell is hereby amended as reflected in the below redlines:

Sec. 2-1. - General rules related to naming of city buildings and other city property in honor of an individual.

- (a) An aApplication shall be required when part of a city building, bridge, park, preserve, or refuge is to be named in honor of a living person, as follows:-
 - (1) Application must be submitted by an elected official of the City of Slidell.
 - (2) All applications shall be subject to strict review, consideration and deliberation by the mayor and city council.
 - (3) Application must demonstrate the following:

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- a. Clear demonstration of a person's commitment to the city including, but not limited to, the commitment of time, talent and/or treasures that serve to improve and enhance the City of Slidell must be set forth; and
- (4) An application shall require a criminal background check be performed by the city attorney's office.
- (5) No city property shall be named in contravention of La. R.S. 42:267.
- (b) Definitions. As used in Sec. 2-1(a)(3):
 - (1) The term "time" used herein is defined as a period no less than ten years.
 - (2) The term "talent" used herein is defined as arts, music, leadership, or other definable acts to be considered by the city.
 - (3) The term "treasure" is defined as a financial contribution to the city in the form of cash and/or movable and/or immovable property.
- (c) Vote.
- (1)—It shall require a two-thirds vote of the city council to adopt an ordinance naming a part of a <u>public_city_building, bridge, park, preserve, or refuge</u> after a living person.
- (d) Signage, plaques, memorials. If all or part of any city property is duly named after any person, living or deceased, it shall be the responsibility of the person(s) heading the advocacy for such designation to provide for payment of the cost of any custom signage, plaque, or memorial which may be required or desired to mark the property site, which materials shall be subject to the approval of city administration acting through the Director of Cultural and Public Affairs and the Director of Planning. Nothing herein shall prevent the city, in its discretion, from providing signage, plaques, or memorials for such name designations if same can be created in-house.
