## **RESOLUTION R09-11**

A resolution by the Slidell City Council supporting and endorsing the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism, will be presenting a 30% budget cut of their department as requested by the Governor of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell Olde Towne Cultural District, Slidell Museum, historic Slidell Train Depot and Heritage Park are served by the Office of Cultural, Recreation and Tourism and may be affected due to state budget cuts; and

WHEREAS, the tourism industry plays a vital part in the economic well-being of the City of Slidell and even more evidently in the existence of the historic Olde Towne Slidell Cultural District; and

WHEREAS, prior to Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, cultural industries and tourism are two of only four industries in Louisiana that account for over 100,000 jobs and in 2004, tourism in Louisiana was a \$9.4 billion industry, the state's second largest, and helped generate over \$600 million in state and local tax dollars; and

WHEREAS The Office of Cultural Development has created a system of funding programs that have become national models of equitable investment of state funds; and

WHEREAS, economic impact studies indicate that for every \$1 invested in the arts, \$6 in local and state taxes are generated, and loss of \$798,624 in funding would decrease dollars returned to the state by \$4.8 million; and

WHEREAS, in Louisiana, the non-profit arts sector creates over 18,000 of the jobs within the cultural economy, and the Department of Cultural, Recreation and Tourism's strategic support of that non-profit arts sector is critical to its workforce.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it does hereby request the State of Louisiana revisit the proposed cuts to the Department of Cultural, Recreation and Tourism and that the State of Louisiana explore other resources to supplement these programs.
