A resolution by the Slidell City Council, Slidell, Louisiana, requesting the U.S. Congress and the Louisiana Congressional Delegation to carefully consider eliminating the rule of operating deficits for three years following Hurricane Katrina as a qualification for loan forgiveness for the Community Disaster Loan Program.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Katrina made landfall in Slidell, Louisiana on August 29, 2005; and

WHEREAS, approximately half of the homes and businesses in Slidell were flooded as a result of storm surges from Lake Pontchartrain; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell's utility system was heavily damaged and customers were lost as a result of Hurricane Katrina; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell borrowed funds through the Community

Disaster Loan program to sustain the utility system during the recovery from Hurricane

Katrina; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Local Budget Act requires local governments adopt a balanced budget; and

WHEREAS, the Federal government has instituted guidelines for loan forgiveness for loans made through the Community Disaster Loan program which require the local government demonstrate operating deficits occurred for the three years following Hurricane Katrina; and

WHEREAS, the repayment of the Community Disaster Loan due October, 2010 would severely impact the financial condition of the City of Slidell.
