RESOLUTION R14-20

A resolution by the Slidell City Council supporting the application to the Federal Highway Works Administration (FHWA) via the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (LADTOD) for Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) for funding to support "SPARTAN DRIVE MULTI-USE PATH" and assuming full responsibility for the required local match and for managing and maintaining the project ("Project").

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell has a long standing goal to improve the pedestrian and bicycle connectivity throughout the city, particularly between residential areas and schools; and

WHEREAS, the main impediment to improved pedestrian and bicycle connectivity is the lack of a safe route along Spartan Drive; and

WHEREAS, FWHA oversees a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) which is not a grant but rather reimburses a City for authorized dollars spent, resulting in a City budgeting for the total cost then submit for reimbursement for the 80%; and

WHEREAS, if the City of Slidell is selected, FHWA-TAP will provide 80% cost share and the City would be responsible for 20% of the project plus all design, engineering and inspection costs; and

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WHEREAS, based on cost estimates, the City would be responsible for \$394,206.96. Additionally, the City would budget for the Federal Share of \$788,413.92, which amount is reimbursable; and

WHEREAS, the Project will support other ongoing projects of the City including, but not limited to, LADOTD's "US 11 ACCESS MANAGEMENT AND COMPLETE STREET IMPROVEMENTS FROM SPARTAN DRIVE TO LA 433," which is currently in the Stage 0 phase.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council, Slidell, Louisiana, in legal session convened, that the Council hereby recognizes and acknowledges the City's responsibilities in connection with the Federal Highway Works Administration via the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for Transportation Alternative Program to support "SPARTAN DRIVE MULTI-USE PATH," which consist of the City's responsibility for 20% of the project plus all design, engineering and inspection costs; that TAP is not a grant but rather reimburses the City for authorized dollars spent; and that the City will budget for the total cost and make submittals for reimbursement for 80% of same.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Slidell City Council, Slidell, Louisiana, hereby supports the application to the FHWA via LADOTD for TAP funding to support a

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"SPARTAN DRIVE MULTI-USE PATH" project.




