RESOLUTION R19-13

A resolution supporting the appointment of a paid Faith-Based Liaison to the St. Tammany Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness organization and the funding of this position.

WHEREAS, the charge of the St. Tammany Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness organization is to develop, manage, coordinate and maintain a comprehensive and effective response to any natural or technological emergency that may occur and which poses a threat to lives and property in St Tammany Parish. This department is responsible for advising the Parish President, Administration Officers, Parish Council and Municipalities regarding emergency preparedness activities and operations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell and St. Tammany Parish have experienced devastation from hurricanes and other natural disasters in the past; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell, as well as other local communities, and the Parish as a whole, have experienced the kindness, generosity and unwavering commitment from local Faith-Based communities at the time of disasters; and

WHEREAS, during Hurricane Katrina, the Faith-Based community responded with churches, organizations and businesses sending personnel, supplies, financial support and other resources, however, initially without coordination; and

WHEREAS, Northshore Disaster Recovery, a local non-profit, Faith-Based Organization, took the lead in attempting to manage, coordinate and disburse resources in the area as the need warranted; and

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WHEREAS, Northshore Disaster Recovery has continued to coordinate and maintain contact with the Faith-Based community in preparation for future disasters and needs; and

WHEREAS, the effort to continue and maintain communications, and the ability to marshal personnel and equipment when needed, requires a great deal of time and coordination; and

WHEREAS, in addition to government assistance to local citizens, the Faith-Based community has provided millions of dollars of relief and resources from within the City of Slidell and St. Tammany Parish; and

WHEREAS, it has been and will continue to be the contributions from charitable agencies inside and outside the Parish and the on-the-ground organizations that make these efforts possible; and

WHEREAS, at present the St. Tammany Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness does not have a <u>fully funded</u> Faith-Based Liaison to coordinate the connection between over two hundred and twenty-eight (228) churches throughout St. Tammany Parish in the event of a disaster; and

WHEREAS, the appointment of a Faith-Based Liaison to the St. Tammany Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness organization will provide organizational structure, coordination and efficiency in the deployment of the resources commended by churches and extra-church volunteer groups; and

WHEREAS, at present other Liaison positions in the St. Tammany Parish

Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness organization are funded by

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their respective sponsoring organizations, the Faith-Based appointment does not fit that scenario and therefore, requires funding; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell desires to support the appointment of a paid Faith-Based Liaison to the St. Tammany Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness organization.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council, acting as governing authority of the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, that it does hereby support the appointment of a Faith-Based Liaison to the St. Tammany Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness organization.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the City Council, acting as governing authority of the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, that it does hereby further support that funding sources be identified to fund said appointment.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this Resolution will become effective immediately.
