A resolution clarifying the boundary of the Olde Towne Preservation District.

WHEREAS, the Slidell City Council established the Olde Towne Preservation District (OTPD) on January 9, 2018 (Ord. No. 3878), codified in Sec. 2-216 of the City's Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Sec. 2-216(h) establishes the exact boundary of the OTPD as "depicted in Attachment A;" and

WHEREAS, the attachment to Ord. No. 3878 is a map titled "Olde Towne Preservation District Proposed Boundary" dated May 31, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the attachment depicts more than one boundary that might be considered the OTPD boundary; and

WHEREAS, Council records establish that the "Proposed Olde Towne Boundary (2016)" depicted as a red line on the map was the boundary adopted by the Council; and

WHEREAS, on June 12, 2018, the Slidell City Council, through Ord. No. 3898, replaced Sec. 2-216 of the Code to modify the criteria for Olde Towne Preservation District Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Ord. No. 3898 did not include a map depicting the boundary of the OTPD.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it does hereby clarify that the "Proposed Olde Towne Boundary (2016)" depicted as a red line on

the map titled "Olde Towne Preservation District Proposed Boundary" dated May 31, 2016, adopted as the attachment of Ord. No. 3878, has been since its adoption on January 9, 2018 and continues to be the boundary of the Olde Towne Preservation District as established in Sec. 2-216(h) of the City of Slidell Code of Ordinances.
