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20. WHEREAS, Section 3-05 of the Slidell City Charter requires
21. that the Council shall provide by ordinance for the designation of a
22. qualified city officer or employee to serve as acting mayor during
23. the temporary absence or disability of the mayor;
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25. BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Slidell:
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27. Section 1: Mayor's Temporary Absence: The Mayor will
28. notify, in advance, the Clerk of the City Council when the Mayor will
29. be temporarily absent.
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31. Section 2: Temporary Absence: The term "temporary absence"
32. shall be defined to mean those occasions when the Mayor will be out
33. of the State of Louisiana for more than three working days (Monday
34. through Friday), not including any official city holiday, Saturday
35. or Sunday.
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37. Section 3: Appointment of Acting Mayor: Upon the temporary
38. absence of the Mayor, the executive assistant to the Mayor will serve
39. as the acting mayor. If the executive assistant to the Mayor is
40. unable to serve, the Mayor will appoint another qualified city officer
41. or employee to serve as acting mayor.

43. Section 4: Mayor's Discretion: When the Mayor is absent

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9. Section 7: Inability to Serve: The term "inability to
10. serve" shall be defined to mean those occasions when, because of
11. physical or mental disability, the Mayor is unable to serve the city
12. as mayor and where the Mayor's attending physician is of the written
13. opinion that the Mayor is unable to serve the city as mayor due to
14. his physical or mental disability.

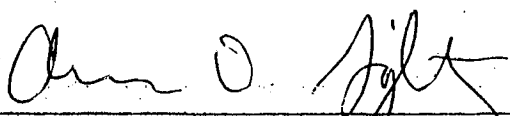
16. Section 8: Mayor's Discretion: Where the Mayor is disabled

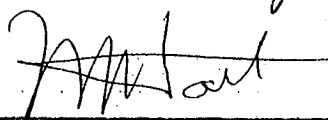

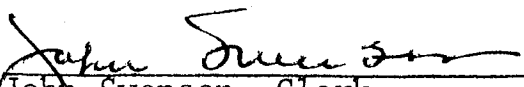
