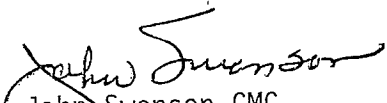

Subject: Ordinance #1224  
Police Reporting Act

Gentlemen & Mrs. Wood:

I am writing to advise that, I, as Mayor of the City of Slidell do hereby veto Ordinance #1224. The purpose of this veto is as follows.

I feel that in order to be consistent with the Administration's interpretation pertaining to the City Charter, it is necessary that this ordinance be vetoed. The portion of the City Charter that I am referring to is Page 4, Section 2-05-Prohibitions. Paragraph "B" of this section reads as follows, "Except as provided elsewhere in this charter neither the council nor any of its members shall involve themselves in any manner in the appointment, removal, direction or supervision of any City administrative officer or employee."

In my opinion, this ordinance certainly directs and supervises the Police Chief in as much as it tells him specifically how and when he must report his activities. I further believe that a request to the Police Department would be sufficient in obtaining this information and this is certainly an unnecessary law in my opinion
