

RESOLUTION NO. 658

Slidell, Louisiana

June 5, , 1962

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, met in regular public session at the regular meeting place of said board in the City Hall in the City of Slidell at 7:30 o'clock P..M. on June 5, 1962, with the following members present:

After the meeting had been called to order and the roll called with the above result, the following resolution was introduced in written form by Lawrence E. Abney, was duly read and considered, and on motion made by Lawrence E. Abney and seconded by C. A. Strickland, was adopted by the following vote:

The resolution was thereupon signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk, was declared to be effective, and is as follows:

RESOLUTION ordering a special election to be held in the City of Slidell, Louisiana, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified property taxpaying voters of said city the question of issuing \$107,000 Jail and Courthouse Bonds and \$111,000 City Hall Improvement Bonds of said city.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary and desirable by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell that \$107,000 Jail and Courthouse Bonds and \$111,000 City Hall Improvement Bonds of said city be issued for the purposes hereinafter more fully set out; and

WHEREAS the Mayor and Board of Aldermen are authorized to call an election in said city for the purpose of submitting such propositions to the qualified property taxpaying voters thereof, pursuant to Chapter 4 of Sub-Title II of Title 39, Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, as follows:

Section 1. That an election shall be and is hereby called to be held in the City of Slidell, Louisiana, on the 4th day of August, 1962, at which election there shall be submitted to the qualified property taxpaying voters of said city (such qualifications to be determined by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana, including particularly Section 14 of Article 14 of the Constitution and Sections 2 and 3 of Article 8

of the Constitution), the propositions specifically set out in the form of ballot appearing in Section 2 hereof.

Section 2. That the ballot used at said election shall be in substantially the following form:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1

Shall the City of Slidell, Louisiana, incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$107,000, to run () years from the date thereof, with interest at the maximum rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, for the purpose of constructing a new jail and courthouse and equipping and furnishing the same in and for said city, title to which shall be in the public?

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2

Shall the City of Slidell, Louisiana, incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of \$111,000, to run () years from the date thereof, with interest at the maximum rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, for the purpose of constructing additions and improvements to the existing city hall of said city, title to which shall be in the public?

NOTICE TO VOTERS: To vote in favor of either of the propositions submitted on this ballot, place a cross (x) mark in the square after the word "Yes"; to vote against either of the propositions submitted on this ballot, place a similar mark (x) after the word "No".

Section 3. That said election shall be held at the voting places set out in the form of notice appearing in Section 8 hereof, and that the persons designated in said notice as election officials, each of whom is a registered, qualified voter in the City of Slidell, shall serve as election officials.

Section 4. That only property taxpayers qualified as electors under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana, including Sections 2 and 3 of Article 8, as amended, shall be entitled to vote at such election. The qualifications of such taxpayers as voters shall be those of age, residence and registration in the books of the Registrar of Voters, as prescribed by the Constitution, without regard to sex. There shall be no voting by proxy.

Section 5. That the polls shall be opened on the day of such election at 6:00 o'clock A.M. and shall be closed at 8:00 o'clock P.M., but all qualified persons within the polls enclosure at 8:00 o'clock P.M. shall be permitted to vote.

Section 6. That it is further ordered that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall meet in public session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. on the 6th day of August, 1962, at the regular meeting place of the board in the City Hall in the City of Slidell, for the purpose of opening the ballot boxes, examining and counting the ballots, both in number and amount, examining and canvassing the returns, and declaring the result of said election.

Section 7. That except to the extent that they may be in conflict with the provisions of Chapter 4 of Sub-Title II of Title 39, Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, the general election laws of the State of Louisiana shall govern the calling and conduct of said election and the canvass and promulgation of the results thereof.

Section 8. That the Clerk of the City of Slidell is hereby directed to publish on the same day of each of four (4) consecutive weeks, not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date set for said election, in the Slidell St. Tammany Times and Weekly News.

Shall the City of Slidell, Louisiana, incur
debt and issue bonds to the amount of
\$111,000, to run thirty (30)
years from the date thereof, with interest
at the maximum rate of six per cent (6%) per
annum, for the purpose of constructing
additions and improvements to the existing
city hall of said city, title to which shall
be in the public?

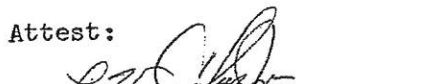
Section 9. That the Clerk of the City of Slidell
