

ORDINANCE NO. 666

An ordinance of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, ordering and calling a special election to be held in the City of Slidell, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, to authorize the levy of a one percent (1%) sales and use tax therein.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, in legal session convened:

Section 1. That under the authority conferred by Sub-Part D, Part I, Chapter 6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:2711, et seq.), and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, a special election be and the same is hereby called and ordered to be held in the City of Slidell, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, on the 27th day of November, 1962, between the hours of six (6:00) o'clock A.M. and eight (8:00) o'clock P.M. in strict compliance with the provisions of Section 1181 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 18:1181), at which election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said City (such qualifications to be determined by the Constitution and laws of Louisiana, including particularly Sections 1, 2 and 3 of Article VIII of the Constitution) the following proposition:

PROPOSITION

Shall the City of Slidell, Louisiana, through its Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the governing authority thereof, under the authority of Sub-Part D of Part I of Chapter 6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:2711, et seq.), be authorized to levy and collect within said City a tax of one percent (1%) upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption and the storage for use or consumption of tangible personal property and upon the sale of services as defined in R.S. 47:301 et seq., inclusive, with the proceeds of such tax to be dedicated and used for the purposes of constructing, re-surfacing, lighting and improving public streets, sidewalks and bridges; constructing, purchasing, improving, maintaining and operating recreational facilities and equipment; and constructing, acquiring or improving lands, buildings and any work of permanent public improvement, including equipment and furnishings therefor, title to which shall be in the public?

Section 2. That the said election shall be held at the polling places set forth in the notice of election appearing in Section 6 hereof and that the persons named in the said election notice, each of whom is a qualified voter of the ward in which the precinct he is to serve forms a part, shall serve as election officials.

Section 3. That only qualified electors under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, including Sections 1, 2 and 3 of Article VIII shall be entitled to vote at such election. Qualifications of such electors shall be those of age, residence and registration in the books of the registrar of voters as prescribed by the Constitution, without regard to sex. There shall be no voting by proxy.

Section 4. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall meet in public session at 2:30 o'clock P.M. on the 28th day of November, 1962, at the regular meeting place in the City Hall in the City of Slidell, Louisiana, for the purpose of examining

and canvassing the election returns and declaring and promulgating the results of said election.

Section 5. That the general laws of the State of Louisiana as required by R.S. 33:2712 of the State of Louisiana shall govern the calling and conduct of said election, and the canvass and the promulgation of the results thereof; provided, that voting machines will be used and the right to vote shall not be restricted to taxpaying voters. The election officials designated shall make due returns of said election for the meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen to be held at its regular meeting place, in the City Hall, Slidell, Louisiana, on November 28, 1962, at 2:30 o'clock P.M.; and that compensation of said election officials be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum prescribed by law.

Section 6. That the Clerk of the City of Slidell, Louisiana is hereby directed to publish for four consecutive weeks, not less than once each week, and the first publication to be not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date set for said election, in "The Slidell-St. Tammany Times & Weekly News", the official journal of said City and a newspaper published in and having general circulation in said City, the following notice of election:

N O T I C E

To the qualified electors of the City of Slidell, Louisiana:

You are hereby notified that on the 18th day of October, 1962, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, ordered that an election be held in said City on the 27th day of November, 1962, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said City the following proposition:

PROPOSITION

Shall the City of Slidell, Louisiana, through its Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the governing authority thereof, under the authority of Sub-Part D of Part I of Chapter 6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:2711, et seq.), be authorized to levy and collect within said City a tax of one percent (1%) upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption and the storage for use or consumption of tangible personal property and upon the sale of services as defined in R.S. 47:301 et seq., inclusive, with the proceeds of such tax to be dedicated and used for the purposes of construction, re-surfacing, lighting and improving public streets, sidewalks and bridges; constructing, purchasing, improving, maintaining and operating recreational facilities and equipment; and constructing, acquiring or improving lands, buildings and any work of permanent public improvement, including equipment and furnishings therefor, title to which shall be in the public?

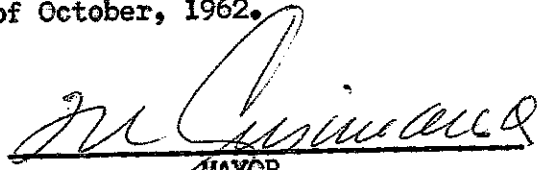

The polls will be open at 6:00 o'clock A.M. and shall remain open until not later than 8:00 O'clock P.M., except that persons within the barriers or within the enclosures of the voting precinct building at 8:00 O'clock P.M. shall be entitled to vote, but no vote shall be cast later than 12:00 o'clock midnight on the said election date. Only qualified electors of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, including Sections 1, 2 and 3 of Article VIII shall be entitled to vote at said election.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that on the 28th day of November, 1962, at 2:30 o'clock P.M. the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, will meet in public session at the regular meeting place of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen in the City Hall, City of Slidell, Louisiana, and will then publicly examine and canvass the returns of said election, and declare

and promulgate the results of said election.

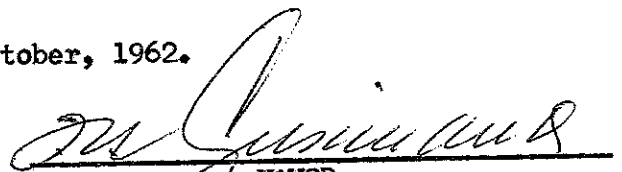
Section 7. That the Mayor be and he is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and furnish to the said election officials in ample time for the holding of said election, the necessary equipment, forms and other election paraphernalia essential to the proper holding of said election.

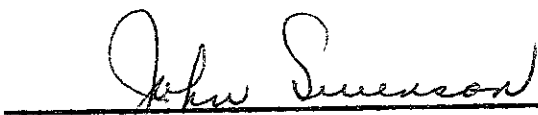
Section 8. That certified copies of this ordinance shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the State Custodian of Voting Machines, the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Parish Custodian of Voting Machines in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, and the Registrar of Voters in and for said Parish, as notification of the special election herein called, in order that each may prepare for said election and perform his respective functions as required by law.

Section 9. That all orders, resolutions and ordinances in conflict herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall become effective immediately and thereafter shall be published in full in the official journal by the City Clerk as soon as practicable.
