

Ordinance 695

An ordinance of the City of Slidell, Louisiana enlarging the boundaries of said City to include 31.34 acres of land.

WHEREAS the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, the governing body of said municipality, did receive at their regular meeting of Tuesday, November 5th 1963, a petition from Welton Hill, William Flanagan and Edgar Cantrell, Jr., constituting more than twenty-five (25%) per cent in number of the resident property owners, as well as more than twenty-five (25%) per cent in value, of the property within said area, requesting an enlargement of the present boundaries of the City of Slidell, Louisiana to include the following described property and;

WHEREAS said governing body did investigate and did find that the said petitioners are the sole owners of their 25% twenty-five per cent of described property and did give notice of a hearing on said petition to be held on November 25th, 1963 at the City Hall by publication in the Slidell St. Tammany Times under date of November 14th, 1963. That said hearing was held on said date and at said hearing no one appeared in opposition to said petition.

SECTION ONE: THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana in legal session convened that the boundaries of the City of Slidell, Louisiana be enlarged to include the following described property to-wit:

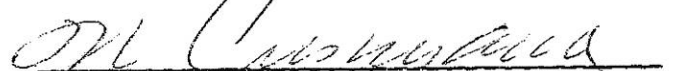
The whole of that subdivision of the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, known and designated as Broadmoor Park, being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

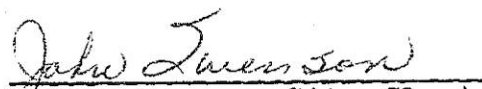
31.34 acres of land lying and being situated in the North Half of Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 14 East, more fully described as follows: From the corner common to Sections 2, 3, 10 and 11, Township 9 South, Range 14 East, go South 89 degrees, 52 minutes East 16.04 chains: Thence South 92 links to a point on the South right of way line of the Gause Road or State Highway No. 1077, which is the point of beginning: Thence South 39.08 chains: Thence South 89 degrees, 52 minutes East 8.02 chains to the Southwest corner of the property first above described: Thence North along the West line of the property above described a distance of 39.08 chains to the South edge of State Hwy. No. 1077; thence North 89 degrees, 52 minutes West along said Hwy. a distance of 8.02 chains to the point of departure.

All according to survey and proces verbal No. 1316 by H. G. Fritchie, Parish Surveyor, dated April 16th, 1953.

SECTION TWO: THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that all of the property as above described shall be included in and become a part of the said City of Slidell, Louisiana.
