

ORDINANCE 705

An Ordinance of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, enlarging the boundaries of said City to include 22.09 acres of land.

WHEREAS the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, the governing body of said municipality, did receive at their regular meeting of Tuesday, December 3rd, 1963, a petition from George E. Reine, Jr. requesting an enlargement of the present boundaries of the City of Slidell to include the following described property and;

WHEREAS said governing body did investigate and did find that the said petitioners are the sole owner of said property and did give notice of a hearing on said petition to be held on December 15th, 1963, at the City Hall by publication in the Slidell St. Tammany Times under date of December 5th, 1963. That said hearing was held on said date and at said hearing no one appeared in opposition to said petition.

SECTION ONE: THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, in legal session convened that the boundaries of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, be enlarged to include the following described property to-wit:

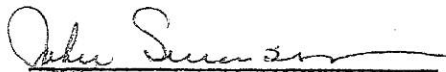
All that certain piece or parcel of land containing 22.09 acres, lying and being situated in Section 44, Township 9 South, Range 14 East, 9th Ward, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, and being more fully described and delineated as follows, to wit:

From the corner common to Section 24, 14 and 23 of said T 9 S R 14 E, go west 1746.35 feet to the stob; thence go south on a road 126.81 feet to an iron pipe in the center of a road which pipe designates the northeast corner of the original Sutter lands now the James Mayfield land; thence go west 924 feet to the northwest corner of Mayfield land marked "A" on plat and set pine stake; thence go South 865.0 feet to the Bauer line; thence continue south 28 feet to the point of beginning; thence go south 991 feet to an iron pipe witness an 18" sweet gum south 42 feet nonidentified; thence go east 924 feet to the southeast corner of Mayfield land; thence go south 528 feet to an iron pipe; thence go west 933.60 feet to an old iron pipe set in the west edge of a branch; thence go north 63 degrees 30 minutes West 670 feet to an old iron pipe witness a 9 inch red oak south 3 degrees 30 minutes East 39 feet nonidentified; thence go north 26 degrees 30 minutes East 1386 feet to the point of departure.

SECTION TWO: THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that all of the property as above described shall be included in and become a part of the said City of Slidell, Louisiana.
