

ORDINANCE 733

An Ordinance of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, enlarging the boundaries of the City to include 23 acres of land, more or less.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, the governing body of said municipality, did receive at their regular monthly meeting of April 6th, 1965, a petition signed by Mrs. Argentine Anderson Black, Mrs. Argentine E. Black Fisher, and Michael Ogden, Grantee requesting an enlargement of the present boundaries of the City of Slidell to include the following described property, and:

WHEREAS, said governing body did investigate and did find that said petitioner is the sole owner of said property and did give notice of a hearing on said petition to be held on April 26th, 1965, at the City Hall as published in the Slidell St. Tammany Times under date of April 15th, 1965. That said hearing was held on said date and at said hearing no one appeared in opposition to said petition.

SECTION ONE: THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the City of Slidell, Louisiana, in legal session convened, that the boundaries of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, be enlarged to include the following described property:

Beginning at the section corner common to Sections Four (4) Nine (9) and Thirty-eight (38) Township 9 South, Range 14 East; thence running East 807.8 feet, thence South 0 degrees 15 minutes West 975.5 feet thence West 1245.8 feet, thence North 82 feet to the lines between sections 9 and 38, thence along said section line North 27 degrees 30 minutes East 991.4 feet, and containing Twenty-three (23) acres more or less, as per survey by J. J. Krebs & Sons, dated April 11th, 1964.

SECTION TWO: THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that all of the above property as described shall be included in, and become part of the City of Slidell, Louisiana. To be known as Forest Pines Subdivision.
