

ORDINANCE NO. 755

An Ordinance of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, enlarging the boundaries of the said City to include Lot 13 and the West part of Lot 14, Square I, of Bayou Liberty Gardens Subdivision.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, Louisiana, the governing Body of said Municipality, did receive, at their regular meeting Tuesday, June 7th, 1966, a petition from Norman W. Sheets, to include certain property herein described:

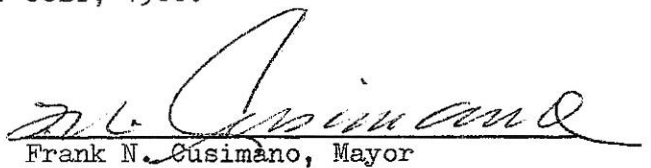
WHEREAS, said governing Body did investigate, and did find that said petitioner is the sole owner of said property, and did give notice of a hearing on said petition, to be held June 27th, 1966, and no one gave notice to the City Clerk desiring to be heard with reference to the proposed enlargement.

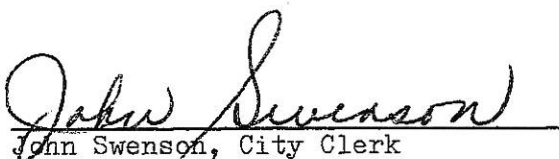
SECTION 1. THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Slidell, in legal session convened, that the boundaries of the City of Slidell be enlarged to include the following described property, to-wit:

Lot 13 and the westerly portion of Lot 14 in Square "I" of Bayou Liberty Gardens Subdivision situated in Section 38, Township 9 South, Range 14 East, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, to-wit: Said Lot 13 fronts 100.1 feet on Liberty Drive and extends in a northerly direction 406.91 feet between equal and parallel lines to the north boundary line of said subdivision on which it measures 100.1 feet in width in the rear. Said westerly portion of Lot 14 adjoins said Lot 13 on the east side of said Lot 13 along which it measures in a northerly direction 406.91 feet to the north boundary line of said subdivision; and fronts 95.8 feet on Liberty Drive; and measures 12.9 feet in width in the rear along the north boundary line of said subdivision, and measures 412.5 feet in depth along the line dividing it from the easterly portion of said Lot 14.

SECTION 2. THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that all of the above property, described, shall be included and become part of the City of Slidell.
