



As advertised, a public hearing was opened in connection with Item No. 81-7-342, a proposed ordinance amending the City's Code of Ethics. Mr. Harold Welsh, Director of Personnel, explained the proposed ordinance would add a new position of designer for the Engineering Department and that funds were approved for said position in the 1981-82 budget. After Council discussion, it was moved by Councilman Caruso, seconded by Councilman Hinton, that Ordinance No. 1424 be adopted.

As advertised, a public hearing was opened in connection with Item No. 81-7-345, a proposed exchange of property ordinance. Councilman Washington explained the proposed ordinance was an exchange of property between the City and CLECO to give CLECO a piece of property that could be more suitably utilized for a power station. Mr. Reinhard Dearing, Council Administrator, stated the legal description of the easement right-of-way needed to be added to the ordinance before its adoption. It was the consensus of those concerned that a verbal resolution be adopted stating the intent of the City to grant said easement. The City Attorney advised the resolution would be sufficient for granting the easement. The adoption of the resolution was deferred until later in the meeting in order to obtain the proper wording. Councilwoman Gallinghouse Hoppe, seconded by Councilman Singletary, moved the adoption of Ordinance No. 1425.

Mr. Roy Cartier of Cartier & Associates reported on the 201 Sewerage Project stating the Step III grant application for Sidel1 was hand delivered to Mr. Tom Griggs of the Louisiana Department of Health and Human Resources on July 31st, 1981. Mr. Cartier reported on the public hearing held August 5th, on the discharge site locations for the 201 project and stated to date they had received no official document from the Department of Natural Resources setting effluent limits. Mr. Cartier stated if the Department of Natural Resources did not set effluent limits before the end of the fiscal year, the statement made by Mr. Dale Givens at the August 5th public hearing regarding the effluent limits could be used so as not to jeopardize the project.

It was moved by Councilman Barthelemy, seconded by Councilwoman Gallinghouse Hoppe, that the 201 Project be tabled until the August 25th, 1981 meeting.
