

MINUTES
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
October 27th, 1981
6:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by President of the Council, Joe Martinez. All Council Members were present with the exception of Councilmen Hinton, Martin, and Caruso. Mayor Hart was present.

It was moved by Councilwoman Wood, seconded by Councilman Washington, that the following Consent Calendar be adopted:

Mayor Hart informed the Council that Mr. Roy Cartier, Consulting Engineer for the 201 Sewerage Improvement Project, had spoken with Mr. Carlos Gordon, City Engineer, and stated they had nothing new to report on the 201 Project and that they were still waiting approval of the Department of Natural Resources' report from the Environmental Protection Agency regarding wasteload analysis. It was moved by Councilman Barthelmy, seconded by Councilman Singletary, that the 201 Sewerage Project be tabled until the November 10th, 1981 meeting of the Council. With no objections, the President so declared.

Councilwoman Wood made opening comments regarding tabled Item No. 81-9-366, a proposed ordinance giving a ten percent (10%) reduction on prepaid water, garbage and sewerage bills. Councilwoman Wood stated she had prepared an amendment to the proposed ordinance which would reduce the ten percent (10%) reduction to five percent (5%) and also an amendment which would grant the Finance Director authority to make rules and regulations for the purpose of administering and enforcing the proposed ordinance.

(Councilmen Martin and Caruso joined the meeting at 6:45 P.M.)

After Council discussion, Councilwoman Wood, seconded by Councilmen Singletary and Gallinghouse Hoppe, introduced and moved the adoption of the amendment reducing the ten percent (10%) reduction to five percent (5%).

ROLL CALL 8 Yeas 0 Nays 1 Absent CARRIED

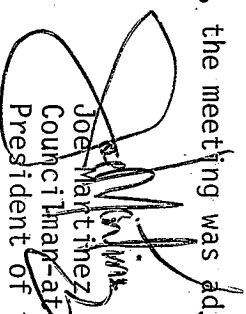
