

MINUTES
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
April 13th, 1982
6:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by Lionel J. Washington, President of the Council. All Council Members and Mayor Hart were present with the exception of Councilmen Caruso and Martin.

It was moved by Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Hinton, that the following Consent Calendar be adopted:

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It was moved by Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilwoman Wood, that the Council's Rules of Procedure be suspended in order to address the proposed Slidell Transit System as submitted by C & M Enterprises, and that thirty minutes time be allowed for discussion.

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Councilman Martin joined the meeting at 6:45 P.M., and Councilman Caruso joined the meeting at 7:00 P.M.

President Washington declared a public hearing open on the proposed Slidell Transit System. Numerous citizens spoke in favor of and in opposition to the proposed transit system. A list of those speaking is attached hereto and made a part of these Minutes. After no one else indicated a desire to be heard, the public hearing was closed. After Council discussion, it was moved by Councilman Martin, seconded by Councilman Hinton, that the Council reject the proposed bus routes for the Slidell Transit System as submitted by C & M Enterprises and that C & M Enterprises conduct a study to determine where routes were wanted in the City and upon completion of said study, C & M Enterprises shall turn over the information gathered to the City Engineer for his review after which the City Engineer and C & M Enterprises will meet to discuss alternate routes for the transit system and will report back to the Council at the April 27th, 1982 meeting.

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As advertised, a public hearing was held on Item No. 82-3-434A, a proposed ordinance amending the Occupational License Tax Ordinance. Councilman Singletary stated he was withdrawing the proposed ordinance as the City Attorney had advised him the City did not have the authority to amend the tax law because the City had to track state law identically.

As advertised, a public hearing was held in connection with Item No. 82-3-435, a proposed ordinance rezoning a portion of Lots 13 and 15, and Lot 12, Square 29, Brugier Addition. The Planning Director explained the proposed ordinance and stated the Planning Commission had recommended denial of said request. Mr. Frank Moran, President of Brugier Homeowner's Association, spoke in opposition to the proposed ordinance. As no one else indicated a desire to be heard, the public hearing was closed. After Council discussion, it was moved by Councilman Barthelmy, seconded by Councilwoman Gallinghouse Hoppe, acting upon the recommendation of the Planning Commission, that said request for rezoning be denied and that the fee be waived for reapplication and the petitioner be
