She introduced Dr. Theo Stafford, Director of the Slidell Memorial Hospital Emergency Department and Mr. Tim Butcher, Nurse/Paramedic of Slidell Memorial Hospital's Emergency Ambulance Service. They spoke on the merits of the proposed 911 Emergency Phone System and asked for support of the resolution.

Councilwoman Williams expressed concern in identifying only one provider. The council was advised that the 911 Commission would have the power to make any changes.

17 Mayor Caruso informed the council that he was still
18 trying to get the Pope to visit the City of Slidell.
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20 Mayor Caruso also spoke on the subject of Operation
21 Rainwater. He stated that the W-15 lateral was almost finished
22 and that he has a written agreement to clean the W-14 Canal. Work
23 has begun on this project and it is almost completed. He said that
24 the North Village Canal would also have to be cleaned out. City
25 Attorney Guillot told the Mayor that we need a right-of-way in
26 order to proceed with this project and she is working on acquiring
27 one.
28

29 There was a brief discussion regarding the Mayor's
30 recent trip to Boaz, Alabama to visit the MRO shopping center.
31 The Mayor thanked Council Vice-President Van Sandt for going with
32 them on the trip. Council Vice-President Van Sandt stated that
33 the City of Boaz has a present population of 7,500 and it
34 employs 8,100 people. These statistics show the employment
35 potential the MRO could have on the City of Slidell.
36

37 The Mayor stated that he was going to be on WARB and
38 WSDL radio on Thursday, July 30, 1987 at 8:15 a.m. to speak about
39 the MRO visit and the city/parish tax issue.

41 Councilman Salvaggio proceeded to introduce the Slidell
42 Junior Police members who were present at the meeting. Their group
43 leader gave a brief description of their organization.

45 AT-LARGE APPOINTMENT TO THE SLIDELL ETHICS BOARD

47 Councilman-at-Large Martinez stated that he has a
48 candidate for appointment to the Slidell Ethics Board and said the
49 candidate is currently reviewing the ordinance. The appointment
50 should be made at the next meeting of the council.

54 Karl Poley of Communications Services of Louisiana
55 approached the council regarding the police radio bid
56 specifications. Mr. Poley decided to reserve his right to speak
57 until the bid opening on the radio system.

59 Councilman-at-Large Martinez lead a discussion regarding
60 the guidelines and rules to be followed by citizens wishing to
61 speak before the council. It was determined that any citizen
62 wishing to speak at a council meeting should first secure
63 authorization from a council member before being placed on the
