An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 2113 Occupational License Tax to provide exemptions for editors or publishers.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Municipal Association through its Technical Assistance Bulletin has recommended amendments to the new Occupational License Tax Law; and

WHEREAS, these amendments would provide for compliance with the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, a recommendation is also made for the reclassification of Theaters and/or Cable T.V. Operator as "All Other Businesses."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that Ordinance No. 2113
Occupational License Tax be amended to exclude any person or
entity engaged in conduct protected under the First Amendment of
the Constitution of the United States of America as follows:

Page 1, Line 62: Insert:

"Except as otherwise provided herein."

Page 1, Line 78: Add:

"Sec. 17-12(a) Editors and Publishers"

Not withstanding any other provision of this ordinance to the contrary, no provision of this ordinance shall be construed as requiring any person or entity engaged in conduct protected under the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America, including but not limited to any editor or publisher, to apply for or to obtain a license, or to pay the tax levied by this ordinance, as a condition to engage in such business, profession or conduct.
