ORDINANCE NO. 2220

An amendment to Chapter 11 Health and Sanitation of the  
Code of Ordinances, to add provisions for collection of liens  
filed for grass cutting and property maintenance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that Chapter  
11 Health and Sanitation, Section 11-53 Liens for cost of cutting  
or debris removal by the city is hereby amended as follows:

First sentence of paragraph delete the language "Where  
the said growth is cut and removed by the mayor and city council"  
and replace with the following, "Where the growth is cut, debris  
removed, or garbage collected by the city."

Last sentence after the language "upon the tax rolls  
of the City", Delete remaining language and replace with "."  
The privilege and lien may be enforced by assessing the amount  
of the privilege and lien against the immovable as a tax against  
the immovable, to be enforced and collected as any ordinary  
property tax lien to be assessed against the property; said  
lien and privilege may be collected in the manner fixed for  
collection of taxes and shall be subject to the same civil  
penalties for delinquencies. The City may also recover interest  
on the amounts secured by the lien. The interest shall not  
exceed the rate of legal interest provided in Civil Code  
Article 2924, and shall be computed from the date of recordation  
of the lien until paid."
