SUBJECT: In response to Rose's request, I researched the two issues she presented concerning drug trafficking in the Housing Authority area.

The Mayor has the authority to set time limits for use of City property. However, he does not have the authority to impose a penalty for disobeying the time limits. Thus, I would suggest that the Council pass an ordinance amending the criminal code and providing a penalty for violation of the time limits set by the Mayor. The Police Department could then enforce the ordinance.

I spoke with Lionel Hicks about this issue last week and I think he is going to talk to Councilman Washington about introducing such an ordinance.

Concerning the parking lot at the Housing Authority, it is my opinion that Section 9-84, Wrongful use of public property, would apply and could be used to partially alleviate some of the problems. Further, I would suggest that Rose write a letter to the City requesting that the Police Department exercise traffic, control in the Housing Authority parking lot. The Council could then pass an ordinance like we did for Homart. See Section 12-4 of the City Code of Ordinances.

Section 9-84 would also apply to use of the parks, however, I would prefer a specific ordinance or an amendment to Section 9-84.
