ORDINANCE NO. 2790

An ordinance amending Chapter 4 Animals and Fowl of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that it does hereby amend Chapter 4 Animals and Fowl of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell as follows:

ARTICLE I DOGS AND CATS, Sec. 4-0 Definitions is amended as follows:

Delete the definition for "Animal" and replace with "Animal: Any live or dead vertebrate creature, domestic, or wild, to include birds and rodents bred and raised in captivity and excluding Homo Sapiens."

Delete the definition for "Animal control director" and replace with "Animal control director. A person whose powers, duties, and responsibilities are delegated to him by the Mayor, and who shall be responsible to the Chief of Staff in the discharge of such duties and responsibilities."

In the definition for "inoculate" after the word "vaccine," add the phrase "by a licensed veterinarian."

Sec. 4.2 Permits, Paragraph (b) - delete the first sentence and replace with "The animal control division has adopted standards for the possession of animals."

Sec. 4-3 Issuance and revocation of permit, Paragraph (b) delete "fourteen (14)" and replace with "three (3)."

Sec. 4-4 Owner responsibility, Paragraph (g) - after the last word of the paragraph add "or at Slidell Animal Control Center. The process of delivering an animal to Slidell Animal Control and paying the required fees and following Slidell Animal control procedures shall not be considered abandonment."

Sec. 4-7 Animal cruelty prohibited:

Delete the entire paragraph and replace with the following:

- *(A) (1) Any person who intentionally or with criminal negligence commits any of the following shall be guilty of cruelty to animals:
 - (a) Over drives, overloads, drives when overloaded, or overworks a living animal.
 - (b) Torments, cruelly beats, or unjustifiably injures any living animal, whether belonging to himself or another.
 - (c) Having charge, custody, or possession of any animal, either as owner or otherwise, unjustifiably fails to provide it with proper food, proper drink, proper shelter, or proper veterinary care.

- (d) Abandons any animal. A person shall not be considered to have abandoned an animal if he delivers to an animal control center an animal which he found running at large.
- (e) Impounds or confines or causes to be impounded or confined in a pound or other place, a living animal and fails to supply it during such confinement with proper food, proper drink, and proper shelter.
- (f) Carries, or causes to be carried, a living animal in or upon a vehicle or otherwise, in a cruel or inhumane manner.
- (g) Unjustifiably administers any poisonous or noxious drug or substance to any living domestic animal or unjustifiably exposes any such drug or substance with intent that the same shall be taken or swallowed by any domestic living animal.
- (h) Injures any living animal belonging to another person without legal privilege or consent of the owner.
- (i) Mistreats any living animal by any act or omission whereby unnecessary or unjustifiable physical pain, suffering, or death is caused to or permitted upon such animal.
- (j) Causes or procures to be done by any person any act enumerated in the Subsection.
- (k) Tortures, maims, mutilates, or maliciously kills any living animal, whether belonging to himself or another.
- (2) (a) Whoever commits the crime of simple cruelty to animals shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or imprisoned for not more than six (6) months, or both.
- (B) In addition to any other penalty imposed, a person who commits the crime of cruelty to animals shall be ordered to perform five (5) eight-hour (8 hour) days of court-approved community service. The community service requirement shall not be suspended.
- (C) For purposes of this Subsection, where more than one (1) animal is tortured, maimed, mutilated, or maliciously killed, each act comprises a separate offense.
- (D) For purposes of this Section, fowl shall be defined as animals. Only the following birds shall be identified as animals for purposes of this Section:
 - (1) Order Psittaciformes-parrots, parakeets, love-birds, macaws, cockatiels or cockatoos.
 - (2) Order Passeriformes-canaries, starlings, sparrows, flycatches, mynah or myna.

- When a person is charged with cruelty to animals, said person's animal may be seized by the arresting officer and held pending final disposition of the charge. The seizing officer shall appoint a licensed veterinarian or other suitable custodian to care for any such animal. The custodian shall retain custody of the animal for the purpose of evidence upon the trial, subject to the order of the court. All costs incurred in the boarding and treatment for any seized animal pending disposition of any animal cruelty charge, upon conviction of the accused, shall be borne by the person so convicted. If a seized animal is unable to humanely survive the final disposition of the animal cruelty charge, the court may order that such animal be humanely put to death, but only upon the certification of a licensed veterinarian either that the animal is not likely to survive or that in his professional judgement, by reason of the physical condition of the animal, it should be humanely euthanized.
- (F) Upon a person's conviction of cruelty to animals, it shall be proper for the court, in its discretion, to order the forfeiture and final determination of the custody of any animal found to be cruelly treated as part of the sentence. In the event of the acquittal or final discharge, without conviction of the accused, the court shall, on demand, direct the delivery of any animal held in custody to the owner thereof.
- (G) In the event of conviction under this section, or in the event of the failure of the accused to appear at trial, the court shall order the animal or animals to be euthanized or made available for adoption."

Sec. 4-9 Animal control officers:

Paragraph (a) - delete the first sentence and replace with "The Mayor or his designee shall have animal control officers and such other personnel as it deems proper, for maintaining a public animal shelter and to enforce the provisions of this title pertaining to the animal control division."

Paragraph (b) - delete the first sentence and replace with "The Mayor or his designee shall have duly commissioned animal control officers, who shall have the authority to issue citations in the enforcement of this chapter."

Sec. 4-11 Redemption of impounded animals:

Paragraph (a) - after the figure "(\$100.00)" add a "," and the following language: "plus five dollars (\$5.00) a day for each impoundment."

Paragraph (a) - in the last sentence delete the word "city" and replace with "custody."

Add a new paragraph (f) - "Animals adopted from Slidell Animal Control must be sterilized under Louisiana Revised Statute 3:2472. Failure to comply with this law may result in the Animal Control Department repossessing the adopted animal. Animal Control may also take reasonable action to ensure animals adopted from Slidell Animal Control are sterilized."

ARTICLE II LIVESTOCK RAISING AND KEEPING RESTRICTED, Sec. 4-12 Livestock prohibited:

After the phrase "City of Slidell" add "including pot bellied pigs,"

ARTICLE III KEEPING OF WILD, EXOTIC, VICIOUS ANIMALS AND REPTILES. Sec. 4-14 Definitions:

Delete the definition for "Animal" and replace with "Animal: Shall include any live or dead vertebrate creature, domestic or wild, to include birds, rodents bred and raised in captivity."

Sec. 4-15 Wild or exotic animals as pets or exhibits prohibited:

In the first sentence, after the word "reptile" delete the rest of the sentence..

Sec. 4-16 Posting of notices:

In the last sentence, after the word "state" delete the rest of the sentence.

Sec. 4-17 Disposition and impoundment:

Delete the phrase "chief of police" and replace with "Director of Animal Control."

ARTICLE V PENALTIES, Sec. 4-21 Penalty:

Paragraph B - delete "chief of police" and replace with "Mayor."
