6 **ORDINANCE NO. 3025**

8 An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 2865 of the City of Slidell Section  
9 2-18(b)(1) to provide for health insurance benefits for City retirees and adding Section  
10 2-18(b)(2) to provide for dependent health insurance coverage in certain circumstances  
11 and amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Slidell in connection herewith.

12 NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that its  
13 Code of Ordinances Section 2-18(b)(1) is deleted and reenacted as follows:  
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15 "Section 2-18(b)(1)

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17 Effective January 1, 1988, a City employee or City elected official who  
18 separates from City service after a minimum of ten (10) years of service and who is  
19 receiving retirement benefits under any retirement plan authorized by the City of Slidell  
20 and who has been covered under the City's health insurance plan for at least one year  
21 prior to separation from City service may elect to participate in the City's health  
22 insurance plan. The City shall pay one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of the  
23 individual or family coverage elected by the said retiree.  
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28 This provision shall not apply to a City employee who voluntarily  
29 separates from City service in order to avoid disciplinary action."  
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31 BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council that its Code of  
32 Ordinances is amended by adding the following new section, Section 2-18(b)(2) is  
33 added and is to read as follows:  
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

5 "Dependents of a deceased City employee or of a deceased elected official may  
6 participate in the City's health insurance program after the death of such employee or  
7 elected official provided that the said deceased employee or elected official was eligible  
8 prior to death to receive retirement benefits from any retirement system authorized by  
9 the City and was employed with the City on a full-time basis or was serving the City as  
10 an elected official after becoming eligible for such retirement benefits and dies while  
11 employed by the City or while serving as an elected official of the City but before  
12 actually receiving retirement benefits and was participating in the City's dependent  
13 health insurance program at the time of death.  
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19 The City shall pay one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of the coverage  
20 elected by the dependent provided by this provision.  
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22 Only those dependents who were covered under the City's health insurance  
23 program at the time of the employee's or the elected official's death may participate  
24 pursuant to this provision."

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
