EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 4168

An emergency ordinance extending the prohibition on underground boring for fiber optic installations and other telecommunications purposes in public rights-of-way within the City of Slidell, Louisiana for an additional period of ninety (90) days, subject to certain allowances.

WHEREAS in Emergency Ordinance 4160, the Council prohibited underground boring operations within the public rights-of-way of the City of Slidell, Louisiana for fiber optic installations and other telecommunications purposes for a period of ninety (90) days and took ancillary action in connection therewith, for the reasons stated therein.

WHEREAS the City has been working diligently since that time to develop new processes and metrics that allow for such boring operations moving forward while minimizing adverse impacts to City operations, infrastructure, and residents, and it has consulted industry professionals in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS the City requires additional time to complete this stepwise process for the benefit of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS as part of this process, the City, through its engineering department, requires the leeway to authorize underground boring on a limited, preapproved, pilot-type basis with companies who were authorized to bore within public rights-of-way in the City at the time of the adoption of Emergency Ordinance 4160.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, as follows:

Emergency Ordinance 4160 is hereby extended for an additional ninety (90) days; subject, however, to the right of the City of Slidell, acting through its engineering department, to authorize underground boring in public rights-of-way within the City on a limited, pre-approved, pilot-type basis with companies who were authorized to bore within public rights-of-way in the City at the time of the adoption of Emergency Ordinance 4160. These pilot authorizations shall be at the discretion of the City's engineering department to develop and test new and varied processes and metrics for potential permanent implementation so as to minimize adverse impacts to City operations, infrastructure, and residents from underground boring operations.

This emergency ordinance shall be effective the day of its adoption.
