## RESOLUTION R85-12

WHEREAS, the plans for development of the front twenty-five (25) acres for Schwegmann's Giant Supermarket will have a dramatic impact on the residents of the immediate surrounding neighborhoods of Bon Village and Heritage Estates, and;

WHEREAS, since the initial plans for said development were first presented in June of 1982 to include a substantial buffer zone of existing trees and green spaces on the western edge of the development, and;

WHEREAS, said buffer zone was always invisioned to include substantial green space on the western edge of the Schwegmann's parking lot, plantings in the median of the proposed boulevard to be built, and most importantly, the retention of existing trees and green space of approximately sixteen feet (16') from the western property line to the proposed boulevard, and;

whereas, the developer has repeatedly pledged to the community and surrounding residents his intention to retain the maximum feasible buffer zone in this area so as to minimize the negative impact on the adjacent residential property, and;

WHEREAS, the residents of the Bon Village Homeowners' were recently informed that said retention of the existing trees in the sixteen foot (16') wide area may not be possible due to the proposed required fill for drainage of the proposed boulevard which in turn may kill the existing trees, and;

WHEREAS, this most recent problem has entirely changed the previously agreed upon sixteen foot (16') buffer zone.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, does hereby request the City Planning Commission, the City Planning Department and the City Engineering Department to immediately re-evaluate the plans for the proposed boulevard alignment, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council does express its support for modification and redesign of the proposed boulevard plans if necessary to retain the previously agreed upon minimum sixteen foot (16') buffer zone, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Engineering Department is hereby requested to review plans for elevations and grades of the drainage plans in the area of the proposed boulevard and to develop alternate plans so that the maximum amount of existing trees and green space can be retained on the western edge of the proposed boulevard, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City is requested to halt further clearing by the developer on this site until this re-evaluation of the boulevard plans and the review of elevations and grades are complete, and;

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this City Council does hereby request the City Administration to withhold all plan approvals and required permits for the construction of said proposed boulevard until alternate plans can be developed to achieve the intentions of resolution, said alternate plans to be mutually agreed upon by the developer, the City and the residents of the adjacent neighborhoods of Bon Village and Heritage Estates.
