## RESOLUTION R85-16

WHEREAS, soon after the birth of Susan and Bud Berger's daughter, Kelly Sue in 1981, they found that she had mucopolysac-charidosis, known more commonly as Hurlers disease, and;

WHEREAS, about forty (40) children are born with Hurlers disease each year in the United States, and;

WHEREAS, a hematologist at Tulane University Hospital directed the Bergers to Dr. William Krivit, chief of the pediatrics department at the University of Minnesota Hospital in Minneapolis, who agreed to perform a bone marrow transplant, and;

WHEREAS, the transplant was a success, and;

WHEREAS, a mid-January trip to Minnesota for a checkup indicated that another transplant will be necessary, and;

whereas, the approximate cost of this bone marrow transplant and all related expenses will be three hundred fifty thousand and 00/100 (\$350,000), and;

WHEREAS, in order to raise these funds, Mrs. Susan Berger has established the Kelly Sue Berger Medical Trust and is asking people to help her, and;

WHEREAS, donations can be made to Kelly Sue Berger Medical Trust, in care of Pelican Homestead, 1401 Gause Boulevard, Slidell, Louisiana 70458.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, proclaim March 16, 1985 as "Kelly Sue Berger Benefit Day" and urges all citizens to support the Kelly Sue Berger Medical Trust in order to help pay for a bone marrow transplant.
