RESOLUTION R86-10

A resolution opposing the financing of State government with a state lottery.

WHEREAS, Edwin W. Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, has called a special session of the Louisiana Legislature to seek approval for a State lottery as means of raising revenue, and;

WHEREAS, the institution of a State lottery will require a constitutional amendment which would require a referendum vote of the citizens of our State, and;

WHEREAS, numerous and well known business associations, civic, religious and political leaders of the State have already expressed their opposition to this proprosal to legalize lotteries to pay for State services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, that we oppose emphatically a State lottery as a means of paying for State services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council calls upon its citizens, State elected officials from St. Tammany Parish, the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury, and other St. Tammany Parish Municipal officials to speak out in opposition to this proposal, whose real cost to and effect on the health and welfare of our citizens is unknown and unmeasurable, as a quick fix for sagging State revenues.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this Council does recognize that the need for additional State revenues and improved State services can only be accomplished with a long term program of solid political, business, civic and religious leadership that recognizes the need to:

- 1. expand the State's economic base and provide good jobs
 for all our citizens;
 - 2. establish a first class political image;
- 3. provide an exemplary public educational system including training in modern job skills;
- 4. evaluate the effects that our current State's entire tax system has had on revenues, and structure an equitable tax base alternative; and
- 5. streamline the State's budget by cutting programs that have ceased to serve a useful purpose.
