A resolution ordering and calling a special election to be held in the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, to authorize the rededication and use of the revenues derived from the one percent (1%) sales and use tax heretofore levied and now being collected therein, making application therewith and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council, acting as the governing authority of the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana:

SECTION I. That, subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission and under the authority conferred by Article VI, Section 29 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, the applicable provisions of Chapters 5, 6 and 6-A of Title 18 and Sub-Part F, Part III, Chapter 4, Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority, a special election to be and the same is hereby called and ordered to be held in the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana (the "City"), on SATURDAY, MAY 3, 1986, between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m., and eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in compliance with the provisions of Section 541 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 18:541), and that at the said election there shall be submitted to all registered voters qualified and entitled to vote at the said election under the Constitution and Laws of this State and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to-wit:

## PROPOSITION TO REDEDICATE EXISTING SALES AND USE TAX

Shall the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana be authorized to fund into bonds the proceeds of the existing one percent (1%) sales and use tax levied by virtue of an election held on Tuesday, November 27, 1962, for the purpose of constructing, acquiring or improving lands, buildings or other works of public improvements for said City, including equipment and furnishings therefor, title to which shall be in the public, for providing a reserve for said bonds and for paying the costs of issuance therefor, said bonds to mature over a term not exceeding twenty-five (25) years from date thereof, to bear interest at a rate or rates of interest not

exceeding twelve per centum (12%) per annum and to be issued in accordance with the provisions and subject to the limitations of Sub-Part F, Part III, Chapter 4, Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, and shall the remainder of the avails or proceeds of said tax in an amount up to one-half of the total avails or proceeds of said tax be expended as appropriated by the governing authority of said City with the remainder of the avails or proceeds of said tax, if any, being dedicated and used for constructing, acquiring or improving the above described capital improvements for said City, title to which shall be in the public?

SECTION II. That there shall be published in "The Slidell Daily Times," a daily newspaper of general circulation within the City, published in the City of Slidell, Louisiana, and being the official journal of this City, once a week for four consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than ninety (90) days prior to the date fixed for election, notice of said election, which notice shall be substantially in accordance with the Notice of Special Election annexed hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference the same as if it were set forth herein in full.

SECTION III. That this City Council, acting as the governing authority of the City, shall meet at their regular meeting place, the Slidell City Council Chambers, City Hall, 2055 Second Street, Slidell, Louisiana, on TUESDAY, MAY 13, 1986, at SIX-THIRTY (6:30) O'CLOCK P.M., and shall then and there in open and public session proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the said special election.

SECTION IV. That the polling places set forth in the aforesaid Notice of Special Election and situated within the corporate limits of the City be and the same are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election, and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively, shall be those persons designated according to law.

 SECTION V. That the officers designated to serve as

Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners pursuant to Section IV

hereof, or such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in compliance with Section 1287 of Title 18 of the Louisiana

Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 18:1287) shall hold the said special election as herein provided, and shall make due returns of said election for the meeting of the City Council to be held on May 13,

1986. All registered voters in the City are entitled to vote at said special election and voting machines shall be used thereat.

SECTION VI. That the Clerk of the Council be and she is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to

SECTION VII. That certified copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the Commissioner of Elections, the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Parish Custodian of Voting Machines in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and the Registrar of Voters in and for said Parish, as notification of the special election herein called in order that each may prepare for said election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION VIII. That application be and the same is hereby formally made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authority to hold the aforesaid special election as herein provided, and in event the aforesaid Proposition is carried, for consent and authority to rededicate and use the revenues derived from the tax heretofore levied and now being collected in said City; and that a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of this City Council, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of this application.
