RESOLUTION R86-47

A resolution opposing the creation of a permanent land-fill site in the center of the City of Slidell.

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell has a severe problem with creosote pollution, and;

WHEREAS, the polluted area, which is included on the Superfund List for prompt dissolution, should be dispersed, and;

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency proposed solution is not to disperse, breakdown or destroy the pollutant, but to confine it in a landfill side of five acres in the center of the city, and;

WHEREAS, this site will be dangerous and unusable, and after a period of time again pose a threat to the well-being of Slidell's residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Slidell City
Council go on record as urging the Environmental Protection Agency
to adopt a solution to this pollution problem that will either
neutralize the pollutants, or transport them to a site that will
not endanger the public or deprive the city of an area potentially
well suited for effective development or purposeful use.
