WHEREAS, it is the opinion of this Council that the manner in which the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury intends to bond the proceeds of the recently passed sales tax will adversely affect all political bodies in the parish; and

WHEREAS, while we would not expect the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury to act in any manner that would negatively impact the benefits of the sales tax to the parish, we feel there must be an alternative method of bonding available that also would not negatively impact the tax revenues of all political bodies in the parish; and

WHEREAS, this Council is in full support of the request by the Mayors of the various municipalities in the parish that the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury formulate their bond issue in such a manner as would allow further annexations of commercial properties into municipalities without negative impact on the Parish's economic development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Slide'l City Council, that this Council is in complete agreement with the contents of the letter addressed to the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury attached hereto; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council, by ratifying said letter, encourages the St. Tammany Parish Police Jury to consider a solution that would achieve the same results for the parish yet leave options open for new businesses looking to municipalities for the services they desire.
