RESOLUTION R87-4

WHEREAS, the Parish of St. Tammany has created Sales Tax District No. 3 and levied a two (2%) percent sales tax therein; and

WHEREAS, the creation of this District will have a direct effect on future annexations into municipalities in St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the United Chambers of Commerce have presented a proposed solution which would benefit both the Parish and Municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Police Jury has rejected this proposal but has formed a committee to study alternatives; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes that the establishment of Sales Tax District No. 3 will result in double taxation of some City property owners and negatively impact future economic development in St. Tammany Parish; and

WHEREAS, this Council wishes to continue to work with the Police Jury to find an amicable solution to this problem but would be amiss in performing its duties if it allowed the prescriptive period to challenge the sales tax district to expire without filing suit; and

WHEREAS, various private parties have expressed an interest in joining the City of Slidell in any legal action which may be filed in order to eliminate the inequity of double taxation on some Parish properties; and

WHEREAS, the Police Jury has threatened several additional legal actions attacking several of the City's annexations; and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney has requested permission to employ an assistant city attorney to assist in handling the City's legal business while she defends these lawsuits;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City
Council that the Mayor, without further authorization from this
Council, may direct the City Attorney or any special counsel
selected by the Mayor to take legal actions necessary on
behalf of the City of Slidell and any property owner of St.
Tammany Parish to halt the bonding of the sales tax being
collected in Sales Tax District No. 3 and have said tax declared
invalid;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor is authorized to sign any and all agreements needed to indemnify the named plaintiffs in any lawsuit filed in connection with this matter by the City Attorney or special counsel, holding them harmless from any expenses whatsoever;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Attorney is authorized to contract Timothy Mathison as a part-time Assistant City Attorney at a rate of \$65.00 per hour;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council hereby expresses its intention to continue to work with the committee appointed by the Police Jury to attempt to find a quick solution to this problem without the necessity of prolonged litigation.
