RESOLUTION R87-8

A resolution in support of the Environmental Protection Agency's decision to clean up the creosote pollution at the Bayou Bonfouca site, and to urge the City to contribute funds to obtain a grant to allow monitoring of the design and incineration stage of the process.

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell has a severe problem with creosote pollution in the Bayou Bonfouca area; and

WHEREAS, the polluted area is included on the EPA Superfund list; and

will include the specifications for the incinerator to be used; and

WHEREAS, a grant for the City of Slidell, in the amount of \$50,000, to be used for monitoring the clean up will be available in the near future; and

WHEREAS, the incinerator discharge and/or residues have the potential to cause harm to the residents of Slidell; and

WHEREAS, the City does not have the personnel, equipment or expertise to adequately monitor the design and use of the incinerator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that, in order to protect the well-being of the citizens of Slidell, the City shall seek a grant from EPA in the amount of \$50,000, which will include \$10,000 from citizens' groups and/or the City as appropriate, said grant to provide outside expertise and all else necessary to adequately monitor the design specifications of the clean up incinerator and to back up the normal monitoring of the incineration process.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this City Council urges the EPA to extend the utmost cooperation to the City of Slidell in using every precaution available in the design and use of this incinerator and in the resulting effect on our air, water, and land during and after cleanup, and concerning any other possible negative effect this cleanup may have on the City of Slidell.
