A resolution recommending Slidell Memorial Hospital Emergency Ambulance Service for parish wide use under a proposed 911 emergency system.

WHEREAS, St. Tammany Parish is considering a possible parish wide 911 emergency system, and

WHEREAS, Louisiana State law requires all ambulance services to transport patients to the nearest hospital capable of providing the necessary services, and

WHEREAS, Slidell Memorial Hospital has an emergency ambulance system presently in operation, and

WHEREAS, this said emergency ambulance system is nonprofit, and

WHEREAS, they are the only governmental entity in the parish providing ambulance services, and

WHEREAS, they are presently serving the entire parish with said services, and

WHEREAS, they are equipped to provide advanced life support care, and

support care, and

WHEREAS, this care is available on a twenty-four (24)
hour basis, and

hour basis, and
WHEREAS, Slidell Memorial Hospital's ambulance service
is presently on a parish wide basis, and

WHEREAS, they operate four (4) such units with two (2) more units available for extensive emergencies throughout the parish, and

WHEREAS, all of their emergency unit staff are registered emergency medical technicians and/or paramedics,

WHEREAS, they employ twenty-four (24) such employees on a full time basis and fifteen (15) more on a part time basis, and WHEREAS, they currently have in excess of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000.00) in said emergency equipment.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Slidell City Council does hereby recommend the Slidell Memorial Hospital's Emergency Ambulance Service as the official parish wide provider of emergency medical services under any proposed 911 emergency system.
