A resolution recommending that the subject of chlorine injection procedures be placed on the Council's Agenda until resolved.

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell has begun a program of injecting chlorine into the City's water supply; and

WHEREAS, the City and officials have had hundreds of complaints about said chlorine usage; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has stated that the City has difficulties regulating the amount of chlorine in the water supply because of several water well sites within the City; and

WHEREAS, a study of the City of Slidell's water supply is presently underway to determine the exact chlorine content, injection process; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Environmental Quality have not established any regulations to date.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it does hereby order that this item be placed on the agenda until the City's water system problems have been solved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor advise the Council of Administrative recommendations as soon as possible.
