18 WHEREAS, the fiscal and economic stability of the State of
19 Louisiana impacts the vitality of Slidell and St. Tammany Parish; and

21 WHEREAS, the Slidell City Council is concerned about
22 fiscal measures being presently considered by state government; and

24 WHEREAS, the economic future of the State is dependent on
25 a viable and successful approach to budgetary problems; and

27 WHEREAS, exotic forms of revenue measures such as lottery
28 may be considered; and

30 WHEREAS, the Slidell City Council's position is in
31 opposition to the use of a lottery for funding government services;

35 WHEREAS, the Slidell City Council feels such a measure
36 (lottery) cannot be dependent upon to cure the State of Louisiana's
37 fiscal dilemma.

40 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, the Slidell City
41 Council, in legal session convened hereby strongly urge and
42 recommend that in the event such exotic revenue measures (lottery)
43 are considered that all revenues anticipated from such a program be
44 dedicated to increase funding of:


