

RESOLUTION NO. 95-32

A resolution providing for canvassing the returns and declaring the results of the special election held in the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, on Saturday, July 15, 1995, to authorize the incurring of debt and issuance of revenue and general obligation bonds.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana (the "City"), that:

SECTION 1. Canvass. This Governing Authority does now proceed in open and public session to examine the official tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, (the "City"), on **SATURDAY, JULY 15, 1995**, to authorize the levy of a special tax therein, and said Governing Authority does further proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of the special election.

SECTION 2. Proces Verbal. A Proces Verbal of the canvass of the returns of said election shall be made and a certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, who shall record the same in his office.

SECTION 3. Promulgation of Election Results. The results of said election shall be promulgated by publication in the manner provided by law.

5 THE SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SLIDELL, STATE OF LOUISIANA, STATE

8 BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED that on Tuesday, July 25, 1995, at Six-  
9 Thirty (6:30) o'clock p.m., at its regular meeting place, the City Hall, 2055 Second Street,  
10 Slidell, Louisiana, the Slidell City Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing  
11 authority of the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana (the "City"), and being the authority ordering  
12 the special election held therein on Saturday, July 15, 1995, with the following members  
13 present:

19 did, in open and public session, examine the official certified tabulations of votes cast at the  
20 said election, and did examine and canvass the returns of the said election, there having been

25 WATERWORKS AND SEWER IMPROVEMENTS

27 SUMMARY: AUTHORITY TO ISSUE 20 YEAR REVENUE BONDS IN  
28 THE AMOUNT OF \$6,400,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
29 CONSTRUCTING AND ACQUIRING IMPROVEMENTS AND  
30 EXTENSION TO THE COMBINED WATERWORKS SYSTEM AND  
31 SEWER SYSTEM OF SAID CITY.

32  
33 Shall the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, incur debt and issue revenue  
34 bonds to the amount of Six Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars  
35 (\$6,400,000) to run twenty (20) years from the date thereof, with interest  
36 at a rate or rates not exceeding twelve per centum (12%) per annum, for  
37 the purpose of constructing and acquiring improvements and extensions  
38 to the combined waterworks system and sewer system of said City, said  
39 bonds to be secured by and payable as to principal and interest solely  
40 from the income and revenues to be derived from the operation of said  
41 combined revenue producing public utility, pursuant to the provisions of  
42 Sub-Part C, Part I, Chapter 10, Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised  
43 Statutes of 1950?

47 STREET AND ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

49 SUMMARY: AUTHORITY TO ISSUE 20 YEAR GENERAL  
50 OBLIGATION BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,045,000 FOR THE  
51 PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, PAVING AND IMPROVING  
52 STREETS AND ROADS INCLUDING NECESSARY ATTENDANT  
53 ROAD DRAINAGE IN SAID CITY, TITLE TO WHICH SHALL BE IN THE  
54 PUBLIC.

55  
56 Shall the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, incur debt and issue bonds  
57 to the amount of Seven Million Forty-Five Thousand Dollars  
58 (\$7,045,000) to run twenty (20) years from the date thereof, with interest  
59 at a rate or rates not exceeding twelve per centum (12%) per annum, for  
60 the purpose of constructing, paving and improving streets and roads  
61 including necessary attendant road drainage in said City, title to which  
62 shall be in the public, which bonds will be general obligations of said  
63 City and will be payable from ad valorem taxes to

4 be levied and collected in the manner provided by Article VI, Section 33  
 5 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and statutory  
 6 authority supplemental thereto?

10 DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

12 SUMMARY: AUTHORITY TO ISSUE 20 YEAR GENERAL  
 13 OBLIGATION BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,555,000 FOR THE  
 14 PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING DRAINS, DRAINAGE CANALS AND  
 15 PUMPING STATIONS IN SAID CITY AND ACQUIRING THE  
 16 NECESSARY EQUIPMENT THEREFOR, TITLE TO WHICH SHALL BE  
 17 IN THE PUBLIC.  
 18

19 Shall the City of Slidell, State of Louisiana, incur debt and issue bonds  
 20 to the amount of Two Million Five Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars  
 21 (\$2,555,000) to run twenty (20) years from the date thereof, with interest  
 22 at a rate or rates not exceeding twelve per centum (12%) per annum, for  
 23 the purpose of constructing drains, drainage canals and pumping  
 24 stations in said City and acquiring the necessary equipment therefor,  
 25 title to which shall be in the public, which bonds will be general  
 26 obligations of said City and will be payable from ad valorem taxes to be  
 27 levied and collected in the manner provided by Article VI, Section 33 of  
 28 the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and statutory authority  
 29 supplemental thereto?  
 30

31 There was found by said count and canvass that the following votes had been cast at  
 32 the said special election **IN FAVOR OF** and **AGAINST**, respectively, the propositions as  
 33 hereinabove set forth at the following polling places, to-wit:

22 The polling places above specified being the only polling places designated at which  
23 to hold the said election, it was therefore shown that (i) there was a total of **1,405** votes cast  
24 **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 1 and a total of **1,956** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 1,  
25 as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of **551** votes cast **AGAINST**  
26 Proposition No. 1 as hereinabove set forth, (ii) there was a total of **1,400** votes cast **IN FAVOR**  
27 **OF** Proposition No. 2 and a total of **1,952** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 2, as  
28 hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of **552** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition  
29 No. 2 as hereinabove set forth, and (iii) there was a total of **1,550** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF**  
30 Proposition No. 3 and a total of **1,802** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 3, as hereinabove  
31 set forth, and that there was a majority of **252** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 3 as  
32 hereinabove set forth.

33  
34 Therefore, the Governing Authority did declare and proclaim and does hereby declare  
35 and proclaim in open and public session that Proposition No. 1, Proposition No. 2 and  
36 Proposition No. 3 as hereinabove set forth were duly **DEFEATED** by a majority of the votes  
37 cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the City on Saturday,  
38 July 15, 1995.
