## **RESOLUTION R98-38**

A resolution requesting Renaissance Media to accept the Federal Communications Commission determination that the cable TV rates for Slidell, Louisiana, were deemed excessive, and to forego any rate increase in 1999.

WHEREAS, on April 22, 1998, the City of Slidell filed an official complaint with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regarding excessive rate charges for the City of Slidell constituency; and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 1998, the FCC upheld the City of Slidell's complaint and further ordered that Renaissance Media (RMedia) reduce and roll back their rates to January 1, 1998 by \$.24 per household; and

WHEREAS, cable TV rates in the City of Slidell have been escalating at a rate in excess of ten percent (10%) a year over the last three (3) years; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell has frequently asked for assistance from its Congressional Delegation and has further asked that Congress extend the Telecommunications Reform Act of 1996, mandating that the cable TV industry continue to be regulated by the FCC; and

WHEREAS, said regulatory authority is scheduled to end on March 31, 1999; and

WHEREAS, at the request of RMedia, the City of Slidell approved a non-exclusive transfer of cable TV services to RMedia from Times Warner Corporation on February 10, 1998; and

- WHEREAS, the Slidell City Council requests that RMedia be a good standing member of our community and accept the determination of the Federal Communications Commission without appeal; and

WHEREAS, the City of Slidell desires to have more local authority regarding rate regulation over cable TV providers.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it does hereby request RMedia to accept the ruling by the Federal Communications Commission and roll back the rate adjustments as ordered by the FCC to the citizens of Slidell and does further request that RMedia forego any appeal to overturn said ruling.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Slidell City Council does hereby call upon its Congressional Delegation to extend the cable TV industry Telecommunications Reform Act of 1996 beyond the expiration date of March 31, 1999, as cable TV rates in the Slidell, Louisiana community have escalated at more than ten percent (10%) per year, and does further request more local regulatory authority over the cable TV industry either through local municipalities or local public service commissions.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Slidell City Council does hereby state its objection to any future cable TV rate increase and further state its intention to oppose and exhaust all resources to prevent any escalation in cable TV rate increases.
