RESOLUTION NO. R01-05

A resolution of the Slidell City Council supporting Senate Bill No. 1 of the State of Louisiana, which creates a public policy for ground water.

WHEREAS, ground water conservation is necessary to ensure the protection of the State's fresh water aquifers in order that the State will have sufficient supply of clean drinking water for residents and enough irrigation for water for agriculture; and

WHEREAS, it is determined that ground water drinking water in the State of Louisiana is on the decline, and that the State will face a crisis within the next several years; and

WHEREAS, most Louisiana residents rely on ground water from fresh water aguifers for personal consumption; and

WHEREAS, a statewide policy is necessary to protect, conserve, and allow for replenishment of fresh water aquifers in the State; and

WHEREAS, drinking water from fresh water aquifers is one of Louisiana's most valuable natural resources and is to be conserved.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it does hereby support the Louisiana State Senate Bill No. 1 which establishes a public policy for ground water conservation to ensure the protection of the State's fresh water aquifers in order that the State will have sufficient supply of clean drinking water for residents and enough irrigation water for agriculture.
