A resolution requesting that Charter Communications include coverage of the New Orleans Hornets basketball games in its present expanded service package for no additional fee.

WHEREAS, the residents of the City of Slidell are facing a 7.2% rate increase in its expanded service tier for the coming year to a total of \$43.80 per month; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the City of Slidell have endured cumulative rate increases of 48% from the 1998 rate of \$29.67 and 82% from the 1996 rate of \$24.06; and

WHEREAS, the provider of cable service in New Orleans and Jefferson Parish, Cox Communications, offers an expanded service tier at \$42.00/month; and

WHEREAS, this level of service includes an all sports channel that not only covers collegiate sports in our region, but also locally produced shows on the Saints, as well as telecasts of 65 regular season New Orleans Hornets basketball games; and

WHEREAS, the New Orleans Hornets' success depends on regional support, which undoubtedly includes Slidell and all of St. Tammany Parish; and

WHEREAS, the Slidell City Council recognizes that Charter Communications has been unable to reach an agreement with Cox Communications to provide coverage of the Hornets for residents on the North Shore; and

WHEREAS, television coverage of these games will not only provide support for the team, but also an added benefit to cable subscribers in the City of Slidell, in lieu of increased rates.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it formally requests Charter Communications include coverage of the New Orleans Hornets basketball games in its present expanded service package at no additional cost to its customers; given the fact that Cox Communications in New Orleans provides this coverage at its \$42.00 expanded service level; a rate which is cheaper than ours without this coverage.
