## **RESOLUTION R03-11**

A resolution urging and requesting the St. Tammany Legislative Delegation to introduce a concurrent resolution directing the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development to reverse his decision to eliminate capacity projects in the Highway Priority Program and to further instruct the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development to continue and expand the capacity projects included within the Highway Priority Program.

WHEREAS, St. Tammany is the fifth largest and fastest growing parish in Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, there is a critical need along I-12 and I-10 for capacity road improvements in growing areas of the state; and

WHEREAS, poor road capacity in growth areas is a serious impediment to transportation safety and economic development and hinders growth; and

WHEREAS, high growth areas are paying disproportionate roads taxes relative to the services received; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development has stated that unless the legislature passes additional taxes there will be no more capacity projects included in the Highway Priority Program regardless of the need for them as expressed by local and regional officials, the State Transportation Improvement Program, and other research documents delineating the need for capacity projects; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development has made the decision to change priorities of state projects to suit his needs without notifying the City of Slidell; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation and Development holds the key to improving our transportation needs and promoting economic development.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council that it requests that when representatives of the Department of Transportation and Development change let dates, or anticipated let dates, of any project within the Highway Priority Program, they are directed to notify the area legislators as well as the local governing authorities within a fourteen day period and allow for legislative review and comment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Slidell City Council does hereby urge and request the St. Tammany Legislative Delegation to introduce a Concurrent Resolution and direct the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development to reverse his decision to eliminate capacity projects in the Highway Priority Program and to further instruct the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development to continue and expand the capacity projects included within the Highway Priority Program.
