WHEREAS, we believe that a spirit of authentic unity and prayer can bridge gaps, heal wounds, and inspire collective action toward a brighter future for all citizens.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Slidell City Council, in legal session convened, to hereby designate September 24, 2025, as a Day of Prayer and Unity Against Political Violence in the City of Slidell.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all City residents, regardless of faith background or political beliefs, are urged to join in prayer, reflection, and community gatherings/engagements on said Day of Prayer and Unity, to stand against violence and

division. Workplaces, community organizations, and houses of worship are urged to help facilitate opportunities for same.
